#### Questions about working with children

#### **Availability and salary**

Clarify when and for how long the nanny is available and what salary you are both considering. It is best to consider your expectations of the nanny before the first interview and discuss them together. How often and for how long should the children be looked after? Are there other tasks that should be taken on, such as cooking or picking up the children?
